## "THERE IS A BOY WHO HAS 5 BARLEY LOAVES & 2 FISH; BUT WHAT GOOD ARE THESE FOR SO MANY"

The disciples discount the rations of 5 loaves and 2 fish as worthless in the face of the overwhelming need in front of them. On the 11<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time, we read the parables of the kingdom where Jesus equates its growth to a mustard seed becoming a bush able to shelter birds. Once again, this time in a miracle, we see the very small becoming very great. At the end of the gospel, the overflowing abundance of life God's kingdom is revealed in the "twelve wicker baskets" of leftovers that remain—perhaps one for each of the 12 disciples to carry down the mountain as they contemplate Jesus's ability to take what is ordinary and insignificant and to transform it into a heavenly feast.
