

Elizabeth is so overwhelmed with joy when Mary comes to her that her body reacts in two physical ways. First, the child she's carrying moves. If you've carried a child, you can imagine what that big kick may have felt like. Second, she cries out. The gospel writer is very specific with this action: she doesn't simply "greet" or "speak," as we may expect. Instead, she "cried out in a loud voice." There's a lack of inhibition in Elizabeth's joy that is unexpected, if not jarring. She expresses loud joy at not only seeing a member of her family whom she loves, but simultaneously making the connection that her cousin is carrying her Messiah. That realization does not elicit demur wonder, but a vocal exclamation. Do you have a family member or friend who expresses joy in a similar way.?
