

It is so much easier to point out other people's sins than to confront our own. Jesus reminds us in the gospel today that when our focus shifts to another's sinfulness, we need to refocus our attention. Following Jesus' challenge, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her," the crowd slowly dissipates. Finally, the woman is left with the only one who *is* without sin, Jesus himself. Instead of hurling vicious words or any other projectiles intent on hurting, Jesus offers the woman forgiveness. As in all things, Jesus shows us the way. We are called to love our neighbors, not to condemn them.
